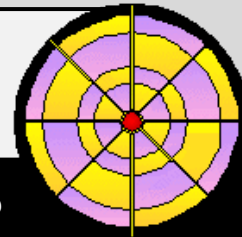

Scotland is hotter than Miami, Rio de Janeiro, Tenerife and Mumbai

Scotland could be on course for a record temperature as a heat wave takes hold across the country - but how does it compare to the rest of the world?

Wednesday was the warmest day of 2018 so far, with a high of 31°C recorded in Aviemore in the Highlands.

This was 5°C higher than Miami. Miami was 1°C lower than Rio de Janeiro, Tenerife had the same temperature high as Miami and Mumbai was 1°C higher than Rio de Janeiro.

But none of these places could compare to Dubai who had a temperature 9°C higher than Aviemore.

What were the temperature highs of Miami, Rio de Janeiro, Tenerife, Mumbai and Dubai on Wednesday?
