'Daily mile' scheme comes to workplace


Businesses across Scotland have been asked to encourage employees to walk a mile a day - following a scheme started by a Scottish primary school in 2012. The exercise is in addition to PE and has been credited with improving the health of pupils.

Another way to keep fit is to run in races. 10k runs are perhaps the most popular running events in the UK. A 10k race (10 000 metres) is an achievable but challenging distance for a beginner and is often used as a way of increasing endurance for longer distances.

1 mile is equal to roughly 1.6 kilometres. How many days would it take a pupil to walk the equivalent of a 10k race?

Sea level fears as Greenland darkens
