Scottish pupils receive exam results

136 889 candidates have received full results of their Nationals, Highers and Advanced Highers. The pass rate for Higher exams has dipped slightly but the total number of passes remained above 150 000 for a third successive year.

The National 5 Mathematics exam is out of 90 marks and candidates can be awarded grades A, B, C and D.

The cut-off score for an A grade in this year's exam was 73%.

Eggs scandal: 700 000 sent to UK but risk is 'unlikely'

About 700 000 eggs have been sent to the UK from potentially contaminated Dutch farms the food watchdog has said.

The Food Standards Agency said it was very unlikely that there was a risk to public

health but some products have been withdrawn from supermarkets as a precaution.

The FSA said the 700 000 figure represented 0.007% of eggs eaten in the UK each year.

Usain Bolt has raced his last ever 100m

The fastest man in world history was looking to add a 12th gold medal to the 11 he'd already accumulated at the 2009, 2011, 2013 and 2015 World Championships.

But the Jamaican faced fierce competition, with American sprinter Christian Coleman pipping Bolt to first place during the 100m semi-final.

Coleman's semi-final time was 9.97 seconds compared to Bolt's time of 9.98 seconds.
