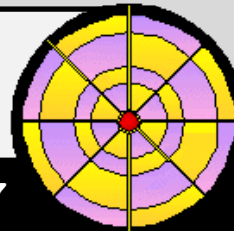

## Hottest June day since summer of 1976 in heatwave

The UK was basking in its hottest June day in 41 years on Wednesday, with a temperature high of 34.5°C recorded in one area of the country. This Met Office reading is the highest in June since the mercury hit 35.6°C in 1976 - the all-time high since records began!
