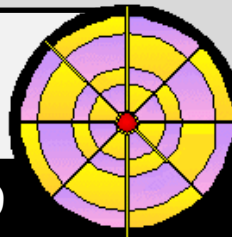

## NASA discover seven Earth-sized planets!

Astronomers have detected a record seven Earth-sized planets orbiting a single star.

The researchers say that all seven could potentially support liquid water on the surface, depending on the other properties of those planets. But only three are within the conventional "habitable" zone where life is considered a possibility.

The compact system of exoplanets orbits Trappist-1, a low-mass, cool star located 40 light-years away from Earth.

One light year is approximately 6 trillion miles.

## The First Details Of 'New' Nokia 3310 Have Been Released

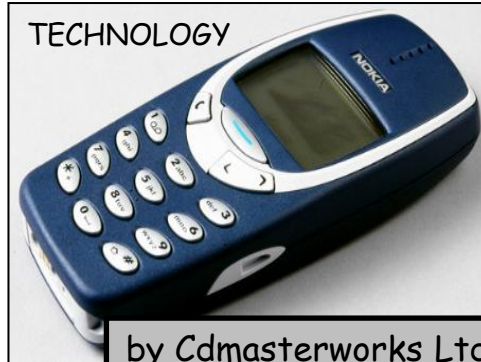
The first details of the new Nokia 3310 handset have been revealed.
