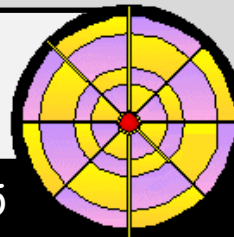

NASA is launching a mission to go and explore a huge asteroid comprised of metal.

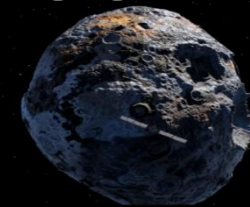

BT announces price hikes for broadband, landline and sport

BT has announced price rises for its broadband and landline services, while television customers will start having to pay for BT Sport.

The company has promised to compensate customers automatically if it fails to deliver on one of its service promises. The details will be published at a future date.

The main rises are:

- Anytime calls up by 49p a month
- Broadband up by £2 a month
- Super-fast Infinity broadband up by £2.50 a month
- BT TV customers to start paying £3.50 a month for BT Sport
