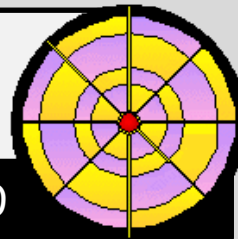

UK 'has never been more addicted to smartphones'

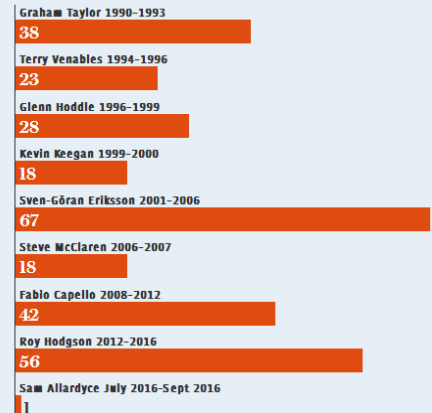
England manager leaves after one match in charge
