Four in 10 children not going to dentist, NHS figures show

40% of children in England did not see a dentist last year, NHS statistics show - a figure the British Dental Association says is embarrassing. The BDA said regular dental check-ups were the key to preventing tooth decay in children and urged the government to invest in educating the public.
