Solar Impulse completes Atlantic crossing with landing in Seville

The zero-fuel aeroplane, Solar Impulse, has touched down in Spain, completing the 70-hour Atlantic leg of its historic bid to circle the globe. The landing in Seville marked the

end of the 15th stage of Solar Impulse's journey.

Stage 7 of the journey was from Nanjing (China) to Nagoya (Japan) – a distance of 2942 km. The time taken was 1 day, 20 hrs and 9 mins.
