Shown opposite are the top ten medal winners as of the beginning of Saturday.





#### Late flurry of signings lights up transfer deadline day

Everton, Fulham and Leicester all made big-money signings as the earliest transfer deadline in Premier League history came to life late in the day. However, the amount spent in the window by Premier League clubs fell for the first time in eight years, to £1.2bn.

## Down the sofa?: 168 million old £1 coins not returned!

About 168 million round £1 coins have not been returned to the Royal Mint, nine months after they stopped being legal tender.

The round £1 coin was replaced by the 12-sided version in October last year, with millions of the old coins being melted down to create the new ones.

But, while you can not spend the old coin, you can still take it to your bank and deposit it into your account.

The new £1 coin was introduced on the  $28^{th}$  of March 2017 to help crack down on counterfeiting, with one in 30 of the old version estimated to be fake according to the Royal Mint .
