Scottish Water to fit 'top-up taps' for water refills

A network of hi-tech taps is to be installed across Scotland to encourage people to use refillable water bottles.

Scottish Water says its "top-up taps" will be fitted in about 30 towns and cities over the next two years.

The first water refill point will be located outside the Scottish Parliament in Edinburgh during October and is part of a drive to persuade more people to carry refillable bottles and cut down on single-use plastic.
