World's longest sea-crossing bridge opens connecting Hong Kong, Zhuhai And Macau Bridge ENGINEERING

The highly anticipated Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge opened last Wednesday, with Chinese President Xi Jinping attending an opening ceremony the day before.

Connecting Hong Kong and Macau to Zhuhai, the bridge is 34 miles long - making it 14 miles longer than the width of the English Channel!
