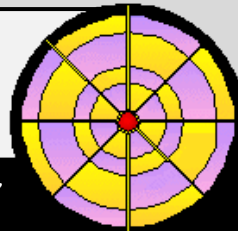

Kenyan science teacher Peter Tabichi wins global prize

A science teacher from rural Kenya has won a \$1m prize for the world's best teacher.

The award, announced in a ceremony in Dubai, recognises the "exceptional" teacher's commitment to pupils in a remote part of Kenya's Rift Valley.

The award winner, Peter Tabichi, gives away 80% of his pay to support pupils, at Keriko Mixed Day Secondary School, who otherwise could not afford uniforms or books.

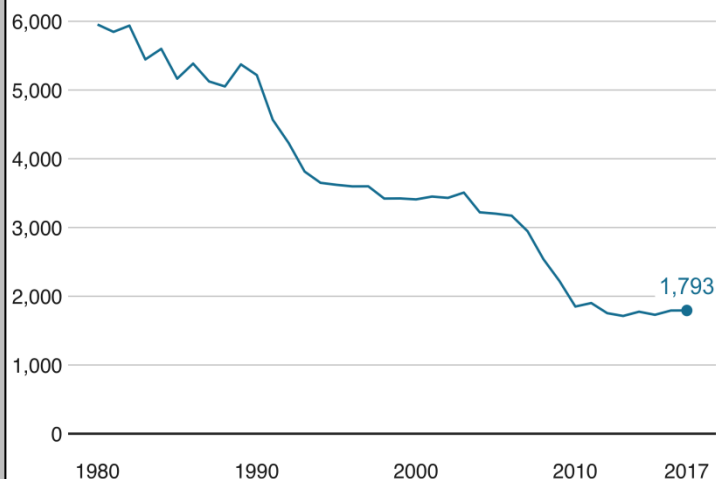

Cadbury offers £10 000 prize for finding White Creme Egg

Cadbury is offering prizes of up to £10 000 to anyone who can find a white chocolate Creme Egg this year.

The White Cadbury Creme Eggs will be camouflaged as regular milk chocolate eggs.
