Larry Tesler, an icon of early computing, has died at the age of 74. It was thanks to his innovations - which included the "cut", "copy" and "paste" commands - that the personal computer became simple to learn and use.

Driving theory tests are changing in April 2020

Theory tests will be changing from the 14th of April 2020, the Driver and



Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) has confirmed.

The adjustments will be coming in across England, Scotland and Wales in a bid to make the test more accessible for all learners.

It takes a typical learner driver 45 hour long lessons before they pass their test. The average cost of a UK driving lesson is £29.20 per hour.

A provisional license currently costs £34, a theory test costs £23 and a week day practical exam costs £62.

A construction worker from India has allegedly beaten Usain Bolt's 100 metre sprint record - with the help of two huge buffaloes.

Srinivasa Gowda was taking part in Kambala, where people sprint 142m through paddy fields while holding onto two bufffaloes.

And he sped through the first 100 metres 0.03 seconds quicker than Bolt's record.

Eight-time gold medal winner Bolt stunned the
