A small-scale Tanzanian miner has become an overnight millionaire after finding the two largest tanzanite gemstones ever discovered.



Saniniu Laizer was handed a cheque for

7.74 bn shillings from the Tanzian government in exchange for his find.

Tanzanite is only found in Tanzania, and is one of the rarest stones on Earth.

#### Man stacks 3 eggs for Guinness World Record
