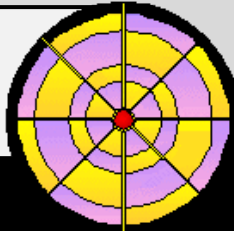

17 year old wins World Championship for excel spreadsheets

An international competition for Excel spreadsheets took place in Anaheim, California, recently. The competition is limited to participants from ages 12 to 22. The top prize went to John Dumoulin, a 17 year old from northern Virginia. He's never worked in an office and is still in high school!



John first learned about the competition through an IT class at school. He scored the highest score on the Microsoft Excel 16 certification exam in Virginia, leading him to a national competition and then the international competition, where he won \$10 000 in prize money.

One of the key skills in using Microsoft Excel is writing formulae. To write a formula in Excel, select a cell and type the = sign. You can use numbers or you can refer to a particular cell to use the value from that cell instead of typing the number.

This spreadsheet shows the homework scores for a particular class. What would be the answer to the calculations below?

(a) '=B2+B9' (b) '=B11-B5' (c) '=B7*B8' (d) '=B10/B3'

Cell C9 should show the percentage of Student H's homework.

The cell contains the formula '=B9/20*100'.

(e) What percentage did student H score in their homework?

Cell C12 should show the average percentage of the class.

The cell contains the formula '=AVERAGE(C2:C11)'.

(f) What is the average percentage score of the class?
