Downing Street has insisted the planned rise in National Insurance will go ahead after a number of Tory MPs called for it to be paused or scrapped. The increase is due to come into


effect in April to help fund the NHS and social care.

Currently, a UK worker pays approximately £1·14 in the pound for National Insurance.

This will rise to £1.25 although anyone that earns less than £9880 will not have to pay any.

In the current system, an employee who earns £20 000 per year has to pay £1251.

This will rise by £89 in April.


After loosing the first two sets 2-6 and 6-7 he went on to win the final 3 sets 6-4 6-4 7-5.

'Megaberg' dumped huge volume of fresh water



Researchers are currently busy trying to gauge the impact a giant iceberg called A68 has had on the environment.

A68 was, for a short period, the world's biggest iceberg. It covered an area of nearly 6000 square kilometres when it broke free from Antarctica in 2017.

But by early 2021, it had completely melted.

The monster iceberg was dumping more than 1.5 billion tonnes of fresh water into the ocean every single day at the height of its melting.
