## MPs to get pay rise next month

## Price of first class stamps to rise to 95p

The price of a first class stamp will rise by 10p to 95p as Royal Mail seeks to cover higher delivery costs while the number of letters being sent falls.

(a) How much does a first class stamp currently cost?

Second class stamps will increase in price by a fifth of the first class stamp price increase.

(b) By how much will a second class stamp increase in price?

The Royal Mail sells stamps in books of 4, 6 or 12. After the increase, a book of 6 second class stamps will cost £4.08.

- (c) How much will it cost for a book of 12 second class stamps?
- (d) How much will it cost for a book of 4 second class stamps?
- (e) How much does it currently cost for a second class stamp?
