Earth Hour 2022 aims to raise awareness against climate change

Earth Hour is a worldwide movement encouraging individuals, communities and businesses to turn off non-essential electric lights for one hour from 8.30 pm until

9.30 pm. This year's Earth Hour took place on Saturday.

Spotify paid 130 artists more than \$5m last year

Spotify has revealed it paid \$7bn to music industry rights holders last year, accounting for almost 25% of the industry's total revenues. The streaming giant said 52 600 artists earned more than \$10 000 from Spotify in 2021. Of those, 130 were paid more than \$5m over the last 12 months. Spotify didn't name any of the artists

involved, but did reveal its most streamed acts of the past year.

We have listed them below but with all of their letters covered up. In order to help you figure them out we have given you a clue for the first letter of both artist and song title.

England schools set for minimum week length in new rules

All schools in England will have to open for at least 32.5 hours a week, under government plans due to be published this week.




The rule will start next September and currently 14% of all schools are thought to be open fewer than 32 hours a week.

Mobile loophole for gaming drivers is closed

A loophole allowing drivers to escape punishment for handheld phone use if they are taking a photo or playing a game has closed in the UK.



You can accumulate penalty points or 'endorsements' for a range of driving offences. These include:

- speeding (3 6 penalty points)
- using a mobile phone (6 penalty points)
- drunk in charge (10 points)
