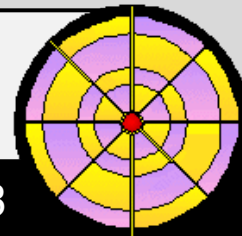

Life sized bust of King Charles made from 17 litres of melted chocolate

Just before his historic coronation at Westminster Abbey, a life sized bust of King Charles has been made from more than 17 litres of chocolate.

The sugary likeness weighs more than 23 kilograms and took four weeks to create. The chocolatier who constructed the creation used 2875 melted Celebrations chocolates.

A 650g tub of Celebrations contains, on average, 71 treats in total.

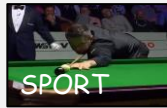

Mark Selby scores the first ever 147 break in a world championship final

Mark Selby made snooker world championship history, by becoming the first ever player to score a maximum 147 break in the final.



In order to score a 147 maximum break in snooker a red ball must be potted followed by a black ball. This must be repeated until there are no reds left on the table.

After this, a snooker player must pot a yellow ball, then a green ball, then a brown ball, then a blue ball, then a pink ball followed by a final black ball.

In snooker, a red ball is worth 1 point, a yellow 2, a green 3, a brown 4, a blue 5, a pink 6 and a black ball is worth 7 points.

How many red balls must be on the table at the start of a frame of snooker?
