# Single use plastic ban comes into force in England - with plastic cutlery and plates off the table

A ban on single-use plastic plates and cutlery and certain types of polystyrene cups and containers came into force in England on Sunday.

It follows a similar move by Scotland last year, while a ban in Wales comes in later this month.

According to estimates, England uses 2.7 billion items of single-use cutlery per year, most of which are plastic but only 10% are recycled.

#### Aston Villa demand new kit after team complain of feeling weighed down
