

## Woman discovers 'one in a billion' spherical egg in weekly shop

A spherical egg has been discovered in a Scottish supermarket.

A woman found the round egg



in a box of 15 she bought while doing her weekly shop in Asda in Ayr.

Now the it is up for sale at Thomson Roddick Callan auction house.

The formula for the volume of a sphere is

$$v = \frac{4}{3}\pi r^3$$

Where r is the radius of the sphere and  $\pi$  = 3.14 to 2 decimal places.

This egg has a radius of 3 centimetres.

Calculate it's volume - bonus points for not using a calculator!
