ScotRail fares set to increase by nearly 4%

Rail fares across Scotland are set to increase by 3.8% in April.

Transport Scotland said Scottish government ministers agreed on the increase - which follows an even bigger price increase last year - after "lengthy consideration" to ensure rail services are sustainable long-term and in line with the budget.
